

PREVIEWS BEGIN FOR THE WORLD PREMIERE OF ELSE WENT'S INITIATIVE

By Else Went Directed by Emma Rosa Went

Performances Begin with a Joseph Papp Free Performance on Tuesday, November 4 and Run Through Sunday, November 30; Official Press Opening on Thursday, November 20

October 28, 2025 – The Public Theater (Artistic Director, Oskar Eustis; Executive Director, Patrick Willingham) begins previews for the world premiere of **INITIATIVE**, an epic new play by Emerging Writers Group alumnus **Else Went** and directed by The Public Theater's inaugural Directing Fellow **Emma Rosa Went**. **INITIATIVE** begins performances in The Public's LuEsther Hall on Tuesday, November 4 with a Joe Papp Free Preview Performance. The production will run through Sunday, November 30, with an official opening on Thursday, November 20.

Playwright **Else Went**, alumnus of The Public's acclaimed Emerging Writers Group, brings her transformative new play **INITIATIVE** to The Public this fall. A bittersweet reflection on adolescence at the dawn of the new millennium, **INITIATIVE** charts the intertwined lives of seven teens from 2000-2004, as they become friends and more than friends, wrestle with their potential, face incalculable loss, and struggle

to find their way in (and get out of) "Coastal Podunk, California." **Emma Rosa Went** directs this epic world premiere guaranteed to make you remember the most difficult and beautiful things about growing up.

"For us to arrive as a company after working so hard and for so long feels like a rare and perfect gift," shares playwright **Else Went** about **INITIATIVE**'S debut. "This play, which boasts over a dozen Public Theater debuts, represents the arrival of a new generation of mature and passionate artists."

INITIATIVE features Olivia Rose Barresi (Clara), Marisa Brau-Reyes (Understudy Clara/Kendall), Brandon Burk (Offstage Voice/Understudy Em/Lo/Tony), Greg Cuellar (Riley), Harrison Densmore (Ty), Carson Higgins (Lo), Andrea Lopez Alvarez (Kendall), Jamie Sanders (Tony), Jose Useche (Understudy Riley/Ty), and Christopher Dylan White (Em).

"It is an enormous honor to lead this company, who have built a real home inside Else's magical script, through its world premiere at the Public," shares director **Emma Rosa Went**. **INITIATIVE** is a monumental undertaking, and we are so grateful not only for the Public's developmental support of the play, but also for championing Else and myself through our positions as full-time artists at the theatre, and for the belief in our company that ensured we get to arrive here as a group. The extraordinary 7+ year journey of this script has brought not only us but our whole community to this moment where we get to share it. This play is a deeply personal offering for us, and we feel proud to realize it at this theatre, with these actors and these incredible designers, with its scale and its vision intact. That was always the dream."

INITIATIVE features scenic design by Mikiko Suzuki MacAdams, costume design by Kindall Almond, costume design dramaturgy by Susan Hilferty, lighting design by Christopher Akerlind, sound design by Angela Baughman, prop management by Aisha Hamida, projection design by S. Katy Tucker, fight direction by Dan Renkin, intimacy direction by Laura Hackman, and dramaturgy by Sarah Lunnie. Janelle Caso is the production stage manager and Molly Foy is the stage manager.

The Public's 2025-26 Season is underway with Emmy Award winner **John Leguizamo**'s return to The Public with the family drama **THE OTHER AMERICANS**, a gripping tale about the American dream directed by Tony Award winner **Ruben Santiago-Hudson**. Tony Award-nominated writer and director duo **Jordan E. Cooper** and **Stevie Walker-Webb** have also returned to The Public with **OH HAPPY DAY!**, featuring original music by Grammy Award-winning gospel artist **Donald Lawrence** for this biting new play about confronting the divine.

The Public's collaboration with Ma-Yi Theater Company continues with the first of two plays in this season's residency, DID YOU EAT? (밥 먹었니?), featuring playwright and performer Zoë Kim's autobiographical journey through love's many forms, directed by Chris Yejin. Additionally, THE SEAT OF OUR PANTS, Obie Award winner Ethan Lipton's irreverently funny musical adaptation of Thornton Wilder's Pulitzer Prize-winning play The Skin of Our Teeth, is currently making its world premiere in The Newman Theater, directed by Tony nominee Leigh Silverman.

THE PUBLIC continues the work of its visionary founder Joe Papp as a civic institution engaging, both on-stage and off, with some of the most important ideas and social issues of today. Conceived over 60 years ago as one of the nation's first nonprofit theaters, The Public has long operated on the principles that theater is an essential cultural force and that art and culture belong to everyone. Under the leadership of Artistic Director Oskar Eustis and Executive Director Patrick Willingham, The Public's wide breadth of programming includes an annual season of new work at its landmark home at Astor Place, Free Shakespeare in the Park at The Delacorte Theater in Central Park, the Mobile Unit touring throughout New York City's five boroughs, Public Lab, Public Works, Public Shakespeare Initiative, and Joe's Pub. Since premiering *HAIR* in 1967, The Public continues to create the canon of American Theater and is currently represented on Broadway by the Tony Award-winning musicals *Hamilton* by Lin-Manuel Miranda and *Hell's Kitchen* by Alicia Keys and Kristoffer Diaz. Their programs and productions can also be seen regionally across the country and around the world. The Public has received 64 Tony Awards, 195 Obie Awards, 62 Drama Desk Awards, 64 Lortel Awards, 36 Outer Critic Circle Awards, 13 New York Drama Critics' Circle Awards, 70 AUDELCO Awards, 6 Antonyo Awards, and 6 Pulitzer Prizes. *publictheater.org*

The Public's Joseph Papp Free Performance initiative will offer free tickets to the performance on Tuesday, November 4 through TodayTix. The Lottery will open for entries on Tuesday, October 28 and will close at

12:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 4. Winners will be notified by email and push notification anytime from 12:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m., and if selected, winners will have one hour to claim their tickets.

The performance schedule is Wednesday through Friday at 6:30 p.m., and Saturday and Sunday at 2:00 p.m. (*Please note: performances on Saturday will include a 90-minute dinner break between acts at 5:00 p.m. There will be no performance on Thursday, November 6 or Thursday, November 27. There will be a performance on Tuesday, November 25 at 6:30 p.m. The performance on Wednesday, November 26 will be at 2:00 p.m.)*

The **Audio Described** performance will be on Saturday, November 22 at 2:00 p.m. The **Open Captioned** performance will be on Sunday, November 23 at 2:00 p.m.
